



## Resolution on the fundamental right of access to water and sanitation

Published on 16 May 2013

## Commenced

[This is the version of this document from 16 May 2013.]

**Recognising** that water and sanitation are a fundamental right, essential to the well-being, health, dignity and development of our African peoples and our States;

**Conscious** that access to drinking water, improved sanitation, and installation of adequate hygiene facilities may reduce disease-related illnesses and mortality as well as have an impact on poverty reduction and socio-economic development;

**Concerned** by the lack of information data related to the poor conditions of access to safe drinking water and sanitation for a large proportion of the population on the continent;

**Determined** to strengthen solidarity, cohesion, cooperation and continental development for the benefit of our peoples;

**Noting** the workshop organised by the Committee on Agriculture, Rural Economy, Natural Resources and Environment of the Pan-African Parliament, WaterLex and WaterAid entitled "Supporting action for sustainable access to drinking water and sanitation in Africa", held in Addis Ababa from 15 to 16 March 2013;

## The Pan-African Parliament:

- 1. Undertakes to defend the principles and actions on the importance of water and sanitation at the national, regional and continental levels;
- 2. Decides to initiate a campaign of advocacy for sufficient budget allocation for the water and sanitation sector;
- 3. Undertakes to promote the post-2015 agenda of the MDGs for Africa; and
- 4. Congratulates and encourages WaterAid, WaterLex and all other partners in their support of the Pan-African Parliament in implementing its programmes related to access to water and sanitation for all.
